- 1. Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 5:43 pm
- 2. Attendance: Quorum present.
- **3. Minutes Approval:** Eilene Beard made the motion to approve. The motion was seconded by Sidney Clopton. All voted in favor. June minutes approved w/o change.
- **4. Perdido Key Gulf Snorkeling Reef:** Waiting for suitable weather/water conditions to deploy the remaining 9 reef modules.
- **5. Mahogany Mill Public Boat Ramp Construction:** Construction completed under NRDA, however, Escambia County MRD is making minor modifications as deemed needed.
- **6. Perdido River Public Boat Ramp Design/Engineering/Permitting:** 60% Design Plans delivered today; MAC review and input requested.
 - Pearce Barrett (FDEP) briefed the committee on the current design and permitting.
 - Gabe Jackson expressed concerns with the turning angle (< 90 deg) from the entry road to the launch area.
 - Walt Woodfin suggested rotating the launch area to join the parking area beyond the launch, which would increase the turning angle (> 90 deg).
 - Gabe Jackson suggested placing the bulk of the dock downstream of the ramp.
 - Robert Turpin suggested angling the upstream dock toward shore to prevent entrapment of floating debris.
 - Dave Mucci made a motion to approve the 60% design as per the following:

"The Escambia County Marine Advisory Committee moves to approve the 60% design of the Perdido River Public Boat Ramp, with consideration of the comments and suggestions made during the review as follows:

- o Length and alignment adjustment of the dock.
- o Mitigation of the turning angle at the launch area.
- o Improvements of access from the handicap parking to the kayak launch area.
- o Consideration of the dock height above the mean high water line."

The motion was seconded by Sidney Clopton. All voted in favor.

- 7. 10836 Lillian Highway Public Boat Ramp: Awaiting FWC ranking of grant submissions.
- **8.** Natural Resources Damage Assessment Oil spill Restoration & Recovery: State and federal agencies are finalizing the Programmatic Envir. Impact Statement. List of projects recently released by FDEP (including artificial reefs).
- **9.** Waterways Access Management: Additional MAC and public comment requested. Recent challenge by individuals refusing to adhere to Park Department Rules. New challenges require additional consideration, and perhaps additional action.

- **10. Lionfish:** Escambia County Marine Resources Division has installed lionfish awareness/reporting signs for boat ramps, fishing piers, and snorkeling reefs. MRD also working with local fishing rodeos adding lionfish rodeo categories.
 - Andy Ross (Gulf Coast Lionfish Coalition) commented that recent tournaments have resulted in the eradication of many lionfish. 704 lionfish were eradicated at one tournament alone.
 - There are at least four additional tournaments coming up with a lionfish category.
 - There has been a noticeable decrease of lionfish on public sites. Those that are shot on public sites are now larger in size.
 - Those winning the lionfish tournaments are using diving private sites.
 - Rick O'Connor stated that they have begun surveying inshore waters for lionfish and are recruiting volunteers to assist in those efforts.
 - He shared that lionfish have shown to be tolerant of water salinity down to 7 PPT.
 - No lionfish have been observed inshore to date.
 - Shelly Mitchell shared a game that she uses at lionfish educational events. The game is a cleaver take on the classic "Pin the Tail on the Donkey", where one pins the poisonous spines on the lion fish.
- **11. Old Business:** Tugboat Ocean Wind available for reefing. PCB samples collected; results expected prior to next MAC meeting. Private sector fundraising still underway?
