#### **BACKGROUND:**

Pursuant to Fla. Const. art. VIII, §1(e), and ch. 124, Fla. Stat., the County Commissioners are required to draw the Board of County Commission districts following each decennial census. The 2010 Census information has been distributed and the Board of County Commissioners requested that David Stafford, Supervisor of Elections, assist in preparing a proposed redistricting plan.

The Board of County Commissioners held two special joint meetings with the Escambia County School Board, one on May 26, 2011, and the other on July 11, 2011. At these meetings, the Boards discussed potential redistricting schemes and allowed for public comment. The Board of County Commissioners then scheduled its Public Hearing for consideration of a new County Commission District map for September 6, 2011 at 5:31 p.m.

The Board of County Commissioners must adopt a redistricting plan before the end of this year. Pursuant to §124.01(3), Florida Statutes. the Board of County Commissioners shall redistrict only in odd-numbered years. As elections are scheduled for the year 2012, it is necessary to redistrict in the year 2011.

AN ORDINANCE OF ESCAMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ART. II, DIVISION 2, SECTION 2-33 OF THE ESCAMBIA COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES; AMENDING DISTRICT LINES FOR THE ESCAMBIA COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICTS BASED ON 2010 CENSUS DATA; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS THAT THE COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICT LINES ARE CONSISTENT WITH REDISTRICTING REQUIREMENTS **TRADITIONAL** REDISTRICTING PRINCIPLES: **ESTABLISHING** COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICTS BASED ON 2010 CENSUS DATA: PROVIDING A MAP OF THE COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICT LINES: PROVIDING BOUNDARY DESCRIPTIONS OF THE COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICT LINES; PROVIDING A POPULATION DISTRIBUTION TABLE THE COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICTS: PROVIDING SEVERABILITY: PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE: PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Fla. Const. Art. VIII, sec.1 (e) and § 124.01, Fla. Stat., the Board of County Commissioners shall redistrict the commissioners' districts into areas of contiguous territory and into districts as equal in population as possible; and

WHEREAS, redistricting is vital to maintaining the constitutional doctrine of one person, one vote; and

WHEREAS, Fla. Const. Art. VIII, sec 1 (e) requires the Board of County Commissioners to redistrict the commissioners' district lines following each decennial census; and

WHEREAS, the 2010 Census data has been distributed; and

WHEREAS, a redistricting plan should reflect traditional redistricting principles which can include geographical compactness, contiguity, preserving incumbents and preserving groups of similar political ideologies:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ESCAMBIA COUNTY:

#### **SECTION 1. Findings**

The Board of County Commissioners of Escambia County, Florida, finds that the commissioners' districts illustrated on the map entitled "County Commissioners' Districts of Escambia County, Florida", attached hereto as eExhibit A, and further described in the district boundary descriptions, attached hereto as eExhibit B, are based on the 2000 2010 Census of Population data and are consistent with the redistricting requirements of Art. VIII, sec.1 (e) of the Florida Constitution, pertinent state statutes and the Federal

Voting Rights Act of 1964, as amended, which prohibits political jurisdictions from imposing any voting procedure that dilutes the voting strength of racial or ethnic minorities. Further, the commissioner's districts illustrated on the map attached as eExhibit A and described in the district boundary descriptions attached as eExhibit B reflect districts based on traditional redistricting principles such as geographical compactness, contiguity, preserving incumbents and preserving groups of similar political ideologies.

## SECTION 2. <u>Escambia County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Art. II, Div. 2, Section 2-33 is hereby amended to read as follows:</u>

#### Section 2-33. Commissioners' districts based on 2000 2010 Census data.

The commissioners' districts of Escambia County, Florida, shall be those shown on the map attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as eExhibit A and comprised of the contiguous territories illustrated on said eExhibit A, and further described by the district boundary descriptions attached hereto an incorporated herein as Exhibit B. The population distribution of these districts, as established by the 2000 2010 Census data, is illustrated in the population distribution table attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit C. The corresponding voting precincts in effect as of November 1, 2001 are shown on the map, eExhibit A, and are also listed on the population distribution table, eExhibit C, but said precincts may be changed without affecting the commissioners' districts as established by this section.

#### SECTION 3. <u>Severability.</u>


It is the declared intent of the county commissioners that, if any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or provision of this section is held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not be so construed as to render invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this section.

#### SECTION 4. <u>Inclusion in the Code</u>.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Escambia County Code; and that the sections of the Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.
