1. US29 Connector Project & I-10 / Beulah Interchange Project

- Nine Mile Road to SR8 (I-10) Roadway Widening with a new I-10 Interchange, then further North to Muscogee Road
 - FDOT managing segment from Nine Mile Road to existing Kingsfield Rd north of I-10, and the new I-10 Interchange
 - County managing segment from existing Kingsfield Rd north to Muscogee Road
 - County and FDOT in discussions for potential agreement to transfer ownership of SR292 (Perdido Key Drive) from AL State Line to south of Theo Baars Bridge to the County, and FDOT assume ownership of CR99 (Beulah Road) from Mobile Hwy to I-10 as well as the future connection north to Muscogee Road.
